REDEMPTION

Colossians 1:14 | NKJV

14 in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

Redemption - you no longer belong to Satan, you have been bought.

- redemption means the price has been paid in full.
- Because Adam sold you, Jesus had to buy you.
- Adams sold you when he sinned.
- That's how Satan could say, "All this is mine," and the Lord not argue with him about it.

But, the Lord has redeemed you.

- All this was planned before the foundation of the world.
- God saw you through the portals of history and redeemed you before you knew Him.
- Redemption was complete before creation was complete.

You are predestined; you are chosen.

When did He choose you? Before the foundation of the world.

- He chose you before Satan was ever created.

Jesus said:

Luke 10:20 | NKJV

20 Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rather rejoice because your names are written in heaven.

He said this to them before their salvation.

- Their names were already written.

This is confirmed in Ephesians 1

Ephesians 1:4 | NKJV

4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love,

God wrote your name before the foundation of the world, therefore, He wrote your name in the Lamb's book of Life before He created Satan, or Angels, or the world.

How is that possible?

Because God knows the end from the beginning.

What about my decision? He saw it before you ever came to that decision.

- He is God.
- He knows your thoughts and the intent of your heart.

God saw your decision and placed your name in the Lamb's book of Life.

- The Lord added to the church such as are to be saved.
- That's why God said to Paul, "Stay in Ephesus, I have many people here," and they weren't even saved yet.
- Jesus said, "*I chose you, you did not choose me.*"

That's what redemption means.

- He bought you back before Adam sold you.

1 Timothy 2:5-6 | NKJV

5 For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus, 6 who gave Himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time,

The work of the cross is the ransom.

- The ransom means: the price, or sacrifice - which is Jesus.

Ransom - life for life like an animal sacrifice.

Jesus could not be a ransom as God, He had to be a ransom as a man.

The mystery is: God became flesh.

Philippians 2:7 | TPT

Instead he emptied himself of his outward glory by reducing himself to the form of a lowly servant. He became human!

- He literally emptied Himself of the godhead.
- He was still God in the flesh but He was as much man as if He was not God.
- He emptied Himself so he was a total man and total God at the same time.

He disrobed Himself of the Godly form.

- So now He's on the earth as a man in the likeness of man and says to His disciples, "*No one knows the day or the hour, not even the Son of man.*"

The Son of man doesn't know the time of His coming.

But, the Son of God does.

- As man He did not know.
- As God He does.

“No ‘MAN’ knows...”

Why? Because He emptied Himself and became a man.

Jesus puts on flesh and then begins to experience His creation.

- He did not know what it was like to be tempted until He becomes a man.
- God did not have to fight sin but when He becomes a man He does.
- God is not lonely until He becomes a man.
- God doesn't experience weakness until He becomes a man.

HE HAS TO BECOME US TO KNOW US.

Now He is in heaven and says, *“Father, before you judge them, let Me tell you about them.”*

- That's why He becomes my High Priest.
- He intercedes with full knowledge of what it's like to be human.
- Jesus becomes our Advocate because the Father did not know what it was like to be tempted but He does.

The Father has never been tempted by Satan.

The Father has never been harassed by demons.

The Father has never had to fight Satan.

The Son of Man was...

- He was tempted in all point just as we are.
- He was tempted as “man.”
- He was tempted because He was a man.
- He identified with me so I can identify with Him.

He was called *“A Man of sorrows, acquainted with grief.”*

- It doesn't say that about the Father.

He becomes so much of a man He takes on Him what I am not able to take on myself.

- The weight of sin literally comes on Him.
- In the garden He fights against sin to the point He bleeds sweat. Resisting temptation.
- He was so tempted to give up He cried, *“If it's Your will, take this cup from Me...”*
- The “man” Christ was speaking this.
- The “man” Christ experienced heaviness, fear, experienced loneliness when no one else prayed with Him.

As much man, as though He was not God.

That is what we mean by “ransom.”

- This full man takes my full place and takes my full death with His pure sinless blood.
- Untouched by sin because of His resistance in the garden.

We do not know when He became sin.

We do know He became sin before He cried, *“My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?”*

- At that point the Holy Spirit left.
- Then Jesus goes, as man, into the underworld.
- He went as a man, the Holy Spirit was not with Him.
- The Son of God does not need to be baptized in the Holy Spirit.
- The Son of Man does.
- So when He was in the river Jordan He identifies with humanity as man. The second that happens the Holy Spirit shows up.

The Holy Spirit did not anoint the Son of God.

- He didn't need to be anointed, He is *“The Anointed.”*
- But, as the “Son of Man,” He needed the Holy Spirit. He anointed Him as the Son of Man.

Now, when He rose from the dead He became again the “Son of God.”

- When John saw Him in Revelation and fell like a dead man because he was looking at the Son of God.

Jesus is His name as a man.

His name as the Son of God is “The Word.”

- He is the revelation of God.
- *And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.*

And so today, He is Jesus, the Son of God, because He is still has flesh.

When Jesus became a man He discovers our:

- Weakness
- Temptation
- Need for sleep
- Need for prayer.

He becomes sin as a man.

He destroys sin as a man.

He goes to the underworld and destroys Satan as a man.

- The Holy Spirit and angels did not go with Him.

Then He was raised from the dead and when He is it is declared that He is the *“Son of God.”*

- Now He goes to heaven and takes on the Godly form again in the flesh. Fully God, fully man.
- When He left heaven He did not have a body of flesh; when He returned He did.

His presence as a man in heaven guarantees our entrance into heaven in a body.

- That is why He is called the “first fruits” of the living.

- We will see Him and touch Him in heaven.

RECONCILIATION

Hebrews 2:17 | KJV

17 Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto his brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people.

He becomes a full man that He might become a faithful and High Priest to make reconciliation for the sins of the people.

- To this day He keeps us reconciled to God in His Priestly office.

Jesus goes to the Father and says:

“Let me tell you about _____.”

- He begins to intercede for you and brings your name to the Father, and what it’s like for you to be tempted, and what it’s like to fight sin.
- So God responds to His Son because His Son has been there.
- In all points, tempted like as we are so He might be a Faithful High Priest.

THE SEAL OF THE NEW COVENANT: HOLY SPIRIT

Adamic - tree of life

Noahic - rainbow

Abrahamic - circumcision

Mosaic - sabbath

Davidic - praise

The seal of the New Covenant which fulfills all other covenants is: **The HOLY SPIRIT**

Ephesians 1:13-14 | KJV

13 In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,

14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

When you buy a house you make a down payment.

The Holy Spirit is the down payment of our redemption.

- If the down payment is this good think about what the inheritance is like.

The presence of the Holy Spirit on your life and mine is the “seal.”

- He is the guarantee of the inheritance we will receive.

2 Corinthians 1:22 | KJV

22 Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.

Ephesians 1:3 | NKJV

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ,

I Am Blessed With 8 Blessings:

① I am chosen

Ephesians 1:4 | NKJV

4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love,

- When God chose you He declared you to be “holy” and “blameless.”
- Phil 1:6 - He who has begun a good work will finish it.

I am chosen to be holy and blameless!

② I am predestined

Ephesians 1:5 | NKJV

5 having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will,

- When Jesus declared “*it is finished*” on the cross He was referring to the whole plan of your redemption.
- Your life is complete in Christ Jesus.
- The “process” continues in your life, but, when God says, “finished” it is finished.

③ I am accepted

Ephesians 1:6 | NKJV

6 to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved.

④ I am redeemed

Ephesians 1:7 | NKJV

7 In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace

- Vs. 3,4 - I was redeemed before the foundation of the world.

⑤ He has lavished me with wisdom

Ephesians 1:8 | NKJV

8 which He made to abound toward us in all wisdom and prudence,

- It was mine before I knew what it(wisdom) was.

⑥ He made known to me His will

Ephesians 1:9 | NKJV

9 having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself,

- I have it by promise.

⑦ I have my inheritance

Ephesians 1:10-11 | NKJV

10 that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth—in Him. **11** In Him also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will,

⑧ I am sealed

Ephesians 1:13 | NKJV

13 In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise,

7 REVELATIONS OF THE SEAL:

The Holy Spirit makes possible all the blessings of the New Covenant.
Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 3:16

1 The Holy Spirit brings new birth. (John 3:5-6) - we must be born by the Spirit.

- You cannot be born again without the Holy Spirit.

2 The Holy Spirit gives us assurance of salvation (Romans 8:16)

3 The Holy Spirit leads us into all truth (John 16:13)

4 The Holy Spirit enables you to put to death the deeds of the flesh

(Romans 8:13) - by the Spirit we kills the deeds of the flesh.

- You cannot put the flesh to death without the power of the Holy Spirit.

5 The Holy Spirit produces in you Christ-likeness (Galatians 5:22-23; 1 Peter 1:3-4)

6 The Holy Spirit empowers you to pray and be effective on the earth

(Romans 8:26-28; Jude 20)

7 The Holy Spirit will raise your body from the dead

(Romans 8:11; 1 Corinthians 15:47-51)
