DAVIDIC COVENANT pt 1

The covenants we have discussed so far:

1. Adamic
2. Noahic
3. Abrahamic
4. Mosaic

Why we are studying the covenants?

- Because we are going deeper, and deeper in the Word of God.
- Because, this is where the real waters are found.

Job 29:6 | KJV

6 When I washed my steps with butter, and the rock poured me out rivers of oil;

People who want God to use them need to start washing their steps.

- You cannot receive richly if your diet is milk.
- You have to go deep to receive from God.

As you mature in the Lord through scripture you begin to see with new eyes beyond the surface and you begin to look for Christ Jesus, the source of scripture.

There are different layers in the scriptures.

- 1st layer is reading: what happened; to whom it happened, and where it happened.
- More layers means - there is revelation truth and depth in the Bible.
- **Greatest Truth:** The whole Bible is a revelation of Christ Jesus.

The Bible is a revelation of one person... JESUS.

Every time you read greater truth is revealed.

The daily study of the Bible a life-long pursuit.

As a young Christian you might think that you can come to a place where you don't need to read the Bible anymore because you have read all of it.

- The Word of God will be revealed to us eternally. It never stops.
- Even when we are with the Lord He will forever be revealing Himself.
- That's why the angels cry "Holy!" Because the revelation keeps going. Heaven is a place of revelation.

Jesus is eternal. He is revealing Himself to you.

The question is: How much can you receive? How teachable are you?

The deeper you go in study of the Word, the richer your life will become.
 The richer you are in God, the more anointed you are in God.
 The freer you are in God.

The reason there are bondages in peoples lives is because there is no “truth” in their life.

“My people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge.”

The reason demons can have access in certain peoples lives is they lack the Word of God.

- The presence of the Word prevents demonic activity.
- There is a place you will get to, as the Word of God becomes rich in you, that you will be at peace 24/7.
- *“Great peace have they that love Thy law and nothing shall offend them.” (Psalm 119:165)*

God’s Word can bring you there.

God’s Word can transform your eternity.

Today we have people walking away from the faith because they have no foundation.
 Now because of more attacks and devils these people are not able to hold on.

The ground is the issue... (Mark 4)

- Good ground will produce 30, 60, 100 fold.

We are a people of covenant.

Every covenant reveals Jesus.

Moses had to reintroduce God to Israel.

- God gives them the Mosaic Covenant which was designed to bring them into faith.

Paul referred to Mosaic Covenant as a “Schoolmaster,” to bring them into faith. That is still active for Israel today and for them only.

That Mosaic Covenant continued through the days when Christ walked the earth.

- Jesus walked the earth during the dispensation of Law.
- Jesus ministered under the Mosaic Law.
- Everything He said in the gospels was under the Mosaic... (and this is where it gets a little deep)

Jesus said,

Matthew 5:17 | NKJV

17 *“Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill.”*

- The Law was not cancelled, it was fulfilled.

What God speaks is eternal.

The Adamic, Noahic, Abrahamic was not cancelled, **they are eternal.**

The Mosaic was fulfilled in Jesus and is forever fulfilled in Jesus. So **it is eternal in Him.**

- **When you receive Jesus in your heart, you fulfill the law, in that the One Who fulfilled the law lives in you.**
- The law is in you fulfilled in Christ.

That law was for Israel.

Jesus was an Israelite who had to obey the law of Moses.

- Everything He preached was according to the law of Moses.
- He didn't come to break or add to the law.
- He preached the same Word God gave Moses.

Jesus fulfilled law.

- Every single day He obeyed it.
- We broke the law (*all have sinned*), and **Jesus becomes our substitute.**
- He received the curse that belonged on us.
- *Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree.* (Gal 3:13)

The church is born on the day of pentecost.

- The (dispensation)age of grace begins for those in Christ Jesus both Jews and Gentiles.
- The Mosaic Covenant is still in tact for the Jew who is outside Christ.
- When they receive Christ Jesus they too will fulfill the law in Christ.

Saved = free from the curse of the law.

When we got saved God placed us under a New Covenant.

- That is why we call our dispensation "grace."
- We are under a new covenant which began at the cross.

During the Last Supper Jesus said, "*This is the blood of the New Covenant.*" (Matt 26:28)

- Fulfilling the old and introducing the New.

When Jesus rose from the dead the dispensation of "grace" began.

- Which resulted in the coming of the Holy Spirit.
- This is why the Holy Spirit could not come before that... the law was still in tact on earth.

Yes, the Holy Spirit came upon individuals prior to the cross, and it was the sovereignty of God they experienced.

The Holy Spirit was not poured upon any prior to pentecost.

- The 12 apostles who followed Jesus did not have the Holy Spirit until after Christ rose from the dead.
- They followed Him, and listened to Him, yet the Holy Spirit wasn't there to convict their hearts.
- None of them, except for Peter, knew He was the Messiah.
- When He died they said, "*We thought He was going to be the Messiah.*"

They did not understand the work of the cross.

Even Peter's revelation didn't last long with him.

When Jesus died Peter said, "*I am going fishing.*"

In Matthew 16 God gave Peter the revelation that Jesus was the Christ but without the Holy Spirit he couldn't keep it.

- Even the ones on the road to Emmaus said, "*We thought He would be the Messiah.*"

Nothing was given to them until Jesus breathed on them and said, "*Receive the Holy Spirit.*"

- On the day of pentecost Peter preached the gospel through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the Mosaic, the Holy Spirit only came upon certain individuals.

- Even they did not know what the Holy Spirit was saying through them.

How amazing is it that we have the Holy Spirit today?

The Davidic is an extension of the Adamic, Noahic, Abrahamic, and Mosaic. When David was King the Mosaic was in tact.

The Davidic covenant was given to David and only David and his seed (Jesus).

- It affects us because it is with the Messiah.

The Davidic was made with David himself after the death of Saul.

- It involved David's seed(Christ), house, throne, and kingdom. (Natural and Spiritual)

After the death of Saul God made this covenant with David.

- **The Davidic points to the Everlasting throne and Kingdom of Christ.**

The Adamic, Noahic, Abrahamic, and Mosaic reveals the Messiah.

The Davidic establishes the "seed." (God begins the process of bringing the seed forth)

- God promises the Messiah in the Adamic, Noahic, Abrahamic, Mosaic.
- He fulfills His promise in the Davidic.

When you read the Bible look for the **line of Christ** in it.

EXAMPLE:

In Genesis 38 **Judah** gets married, has three sons. The first dies, then the second, and the first son's wife was promised to the youngest. But when he was grown she was not given to him and so she played the harlot and slept with Judah, her father-in-law.

Why is this in there?

Her seed becomes the line of the Messiah.

- It's in the Bible because it connects the dots.
- Everything in the Bible deals with the seed.

Ruth - a Moabite who was married to Naomi's son.

She won't leave Naomi and comes to the promise land and becomes the wife of Boaz.

Why is that in there?

- Boaz becomes the father of Obed, the father of Jesse, the father of David.
- **Ruth, a Gentile, is in the line of the Messiah.**

You follow a stream in the Bible... the line of the Messiah.

God is concerned with one thing and one thing only... the promised **seed**.

God made sure that **seed** came through each generation until it was fulfilled in Mary.

- A wicked queen killed all the royals except one... why? The **seed** had to live.
- Satan was trying to stop the line.
- He has been fighting that seed from the beginning.

At first he tried to stop it by having the sons of God sleep with all the women on the earth.

But, God rescues on man... Noah.

The **seed** is still alive through Egypt, through Babylon.

God kept that **seed** alive.

Satan tried to start battles for one purpose... to stop the **seed**.

Why did Satan introduce idol worship? To stop the **seed**.

God gets to David and says, "You're the man."

The Davidic is an extension of the Abrahamic because it confirms the Abrahamic.

David becomes the man through whom the **seed** will come.

It not only confirms, it amplifies it.

God gives the promised Christ in the Adamic, Noahic, and the Abrahamic.

But in the Mosaic there is not much mention of the promised Christ.

- What we have in the Mosaic is it runs parallel to the Abrahamic.
- It's talking about the natural seed (Israel) through whom the Messiah will come.
- So the promise is still there but he's there through Israel.

Now, when you are introduced to the Davidic, it bypasses the Mosaic and is connected to the Abrahamic.

God told Abraham, "*In your seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed.*"

- So the Davidic becomes the confirmation of the Abrahamic.

The main promise of the Abrahamic Covenant was the Messiah.

Genesis 22:16-18 | KJV

16 *And said, By myself have I sworn, saith the Lord, for because thou hast done this thing, and hast not withheld thy son, thine only son:*

17 *That in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy **seed** as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which is upon the sea shore; and thy **seed** shall possess the gate of his enemies;*

18 *And in thy **seed** shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.*

Abraham understood what God was saying through the offering of his son Isaac.

- Isaac was a revelation of Christ.

2 **seeds** from Genesis 22:

1. The nation of Israel
2. The Messiah - Christ shall possess the gate of His enemies.

Vs 18 - **seed** = Christ

God there promised the kingdom of Christ.

- Talking about Him being a King and having a Kingdom.

Now God says to David, “*Through you the King will come and I will establish His throne forever.*”

God is giving the promise to David:

Isaiah 9:6-9 | KJV

6 *For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.*

7 *Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.*

God promises that through David a King would reign forever.
His name is Jesus.

The Davidic Covenant deals only with the promised Messiah.

Psalms 132:11 | KJV

11 *The Lord hath sworn in truth unto David; he will not turn from it; Of the fruit of thy body will I set upon thy throne.*

Luke 1:30-33 | KJV

30 *And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God.*

31 *And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name Jesus.*

32 *He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David:*

33 *And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.*

God clearly showed Abraham a king (Gen 22:17).

After Abraham offered up Isaac God gives him a promise.
