## ABRAHAMIC COVENANT pt 3

We serve a:

Covenant making, keeping, revealing, enabling God.

- We are a covenant people.

God Almighty only speaks, listens, and touches those who are in covenant.

God is the originator of the covenants.

1. **Adamic Covenant**
2. **Noahic Covenant**
3. **Abrahamic Covenant**

Every covenant has: ① Promises, ② Terms, ③ Blood, & ④ Seal (token, application)

The Adamic Covenant had 5 promises:

- ① Be fruitful
- ② Multiply
- ③ Replenish
- ④ Subdue
- ⑤ Have dominion

Terms: Don't eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

The blood: God opened man's side. (Like Christ on the cross)

Man broke the terms.

God rescued the covenant by not allowing Adam to touch the tree of life.

God gives Noah the exact same promises.

- There was a **blood** sacrifice.
- **Terms**: Have faith in God (look to Me)
- **Seal**: the rainbow (God's commitment to man and man's to God)

Abrahamic

The Noahic was broken through Nimrod, the seed of Noah.

- Noah's seed was to replenish the earth but Nimrod opposed this.
- So God scattered them across the earth.

The Adamic & Noahic covenants are still in tact when we come to the Abrahamic Covenant.

The Abrahamic Covenant was made with:

**Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Israel** and the **church** through Jesus.

- This affects "you."

We are the **seed** of Abraham by faith.

- "**Seeds**" - God is talking about Hagar, Ishmael, Esau, Keturah, and their children.
- "**Seed**" - deals with Jesus Who came through Isaac. (The promise child)

(Genesis 3:15) God said, "*The seed of woman will crush your head.*"

- This speaks of the virgin birth.

If you read the genealogy's of Matthew and Luke you'll see something different.

- Matthew goes back to David's son, **Solomon**
- Luke goes back to David's son, **Nathan**
  - Matthew - Seed of the man (Solomon - Joseph)
  - Luke - Seed of the woman (**Nathan - Mary**)

Solomon - Joseph was the seed of Solomon

- this line was cursed in Jeremiah because of sin in Israel. (Jer 22:5)

The seed of the woman came from Mary. Nathan - Mary

- That is the seed of the woman, which had to come through Isaac.
- The seed of the woman became the seed of Abraham.

This seed came through Isaac, not Ishmael.

- As we read the Bible God talks about one thing, and one thing only: redemption.
- The Redeemer is the promised seed.

People want to talk about: "Are their angels on other planets?"

- It doesn't deal with redemption.
- Anything with redemption is in the Bible.

God is not interested in introducing you to other worlds.

- If He was it would be in the Bible.

**BIBLE: THE STORY OF REDEMPTION.**

Don't search the bible for other things.

- people make things up that aren't even there because they so want to believe them.

When the angel was asked for his name in Judges he said, "What does my name have to do with any of this?"

- **Even angels stay away from anything that is not connected to our redemption.**

The Abrahamic Covenant

Israel is in the line of redemption.

- That is why Israel cannot be destroyed.
- If they were, redemption would be destroyed.

Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob = the line of redemption.

- The only reason Ishmael is mentioned is because he is Abraham's offspring.

God doesn't reference Ishmael outside of his genealogy because he is an enemy that fought, opposed, and rejected the covenant.

Through Jacob, present day Israel is connected to our redemption.

Even though blinded, one day the scales will come off their eyes because they are in the line of the covenant promises of God.

The Blessings of Abraham

*"In Abraham all the nations of the earth shall be blessed."*

- That's the gospel. **JESUS CHRIST.**

There are the personal blessings (seeds) - nothing do with redemption  
There are the spiritual blessings (seed) - everything to do with redemption  
- We must be able to separate them both.

Paul was trying to explain in Galatians the difference between Ishmael and Isaac saying:  
▸ Ishmael represents the flesh, ▸ Isaac represents the spirit.

There is a tremendous gap between both.  
- They will be blessed because they are Abraham's seed.

## The Abrahamic Blessings:

The first blessing came through Melchizedek.

Who was Melchizedek? He is what is referred to as a "Theophany" (a visible manifestation of God)

- We do not know fully who He is.
- We do know His office is an office that reveals Christ's office.

Some believe he was a theophany, Christ in the flesh who was called "King of Righteousness."  
- I believe He was a theophany of Christ.

Some believe he was a king of some kingdom...  
Melchizedek gave Abraham the first blessing.

"And he blessed him and said: "Blessed be Abram of God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth; And blessed be God Most High, Who has delivered your enemies into your hand." And he gave him a tithe of all."

Genesis 14:19-20 | NKJV

The first blessing:

### 1 Deliverance from enemies.

- That's a spiritual blessing for the seed Christ Jesus and His church.

### 2 Material prosperity (Gen 13:2; Gen 24:1,35)

- Blessed materially for the seed and seeds both.

### 3 Physical Health (Rom 4:17-21)

- Even though Abraham's body was dead.
- Healing is in the line of blessings.

Healing is in the spiritual stream, not the natural stream.

### 4 I will make you a blessing (Gen 12:2)

- Power to bless others.
- That's not in the natural line.
- Only covenant people can truly bless others.

### 5 I will bless them that bless you.

- Anyone who blesses you is blessed.
- Anyone who curses you is cursed.
- This is in the spiritual stream.

**6 God promised to bless all the families of the earth through Abraham's "seed."** (Gen 12:3)

- Christ Jesus and the gospel.
- The divine gospel

**7 God promises to bless him and multiply him** (Gen 22:17-18)

- both natural and spiritual.

That blessing belongs mainly to the spiritual line.

- Isaac, Jacob, present day Israel.
- That promise is so powerful that the nation of Israel cannot ever be eliminated.

Israel has been cut down many times, but not eliminated.

- Where are the Babylonians?
- Where are the Assyrians?
- Where are the Philistines?
- They have been removed. But Israel is still here and that's a miracle.

*"I will multiply you."*

- Against the Hitlers of the future I will multiply you.

One day God said, *"I will make an end of all nations."*

- One day there will only be one nation on the globe... Israel.
- It will inhabit the globe.

Because the prophet said,

"Though I make a full end of all nations where I have scattered you, Yet I will not make a complete end of you."

**Jeremiah 30:11** | NKJV

Why will the millennium come? To eliminate all rebellion from the earth.

- When Jesus returns He will allow the heathen to rebel against Him and His rule for a thousand years.
- The fire of God will fall...
- In the second war of Gog and Magog (there are two called Gog and Magog in Ezekiel and Revelation) He will destroy the rebellious and the only people left will be the righteous. The Israel of God.

When God creates a brand new heaven and earth who will live on it?

- Israel. Who is Israel? You're in it!
- There will only be one nation and Christ will be King forever.

That will fulfill the Abrahamic Covenant.

**8 To thee and thy seed I will give this land forever** (Gen 12:1; 13:14-18)

- That is in the spiritual side of the blessing.

- God promised the land forever.
- Today they are trying to take it away from Abraham (Israel) and his “seed.”

Whenever the Bible says seed it means Isaac, Jacob, Israel, Christ, and the church = the “seed.”

Who is going to reign from Jerusalem? Jesus.

- He will reign forever.
- The blessing of the land of Israel will belong to the seed of Abraham.
  - This promise began to be fulfilled when Joshua began to possess the land.
  - That promises has not been completed yet fully.
  - It will fully be fulfilled in Christ Jesus when He returns.

## 9 A divine relationship

“And I will establish my covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee in their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be a God unto thee, and to thy seed after thee. And I will give unto thee, and to thy seed after thee, the land wherein thou art a stranger, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession; and I will be their God.”

**Genesis 17:7-8** | KJV

“Between me and thee.” - that’s a divine relationship.

It’s God’s covenant, not mine.

“Seed” - line of Jacob
